I write in connection with your request for information received on 12th August. I note you seek access to the following information:

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information: The top 10 highest recorded speeding offences within the past year (11th August 2018 - 11th August 2019 inclusive). For each offence, please include the recorded speed, the speed limit of the road, and the name of the road.

I would also appreciate any recorded video or photographic evidence of the offences if it is available, but if this would exceed the financial limits of the request, then please ignore this part of the request.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (The Act) to handle all requests in a manner that is blind to the identity of the requestor. Any information released in response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore, in the public domain without caveat.
